McNick's academic offerings are customized to each student, including AP/honors and college-prep courses, College Credit Plus opportunities, and our SAIL program, supporting students with learning accomodations. In the past two years our students earned 12 National Merit awards and 74% of our SAIL students achieved 1st/2nd honors. Our dedicated faculty—73% of which hold advanced degrees—have led our students to the Ohio Governor's Award for STEM Excellence for 30 consecutive years, as well as numerous awards for our renown art, architecture, and theater programs.
